as clear as anything can be when you're talking about a fluid area of law that's constantly interpreted and reinterpreted. So once again the purpose of these three WHEREAS paragraphs is, number one, to state that the current state of the law is this isn't going to matter. Retrocession isn't going to make any difference one way or the other.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: And I have the Attorney General's Opinion here on my desk if any of you would like to review the pertinent paragraphs. And purpose number two is to cement this commitment that has been made to us in good faith that it's not going to happen, it's not going to happen before the year 2000. So I think it's in all of our interest to leave these WHEREAS paragraphs in the resolution because I know the gambling issue is foremost on the minds of a number of you in the body and certainly in the minds of hundreds of people outside the body and I think we should deal with it in this resolution and deal with it in this fashion. And again, Senator Goll and I can visit over the lunch hour about this in some detail, but if there is a vote on this before we break for lunch, I would urge you not to support taking these paragraphs out. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, I move to recess until one-thirty.
