

River by the cavalry back, I think, in 1863 and they landed in the Omaha Tribe and took refuge there. And the Omahas gave them part of their tribe. They let them stay there. Now, granted, we did make a mistake. We made a lot of mistakes in this country when it deals with Indians. We talk about the Indians are going to do what they want to do after retrocession is passed, about they will promise this, they will promise that. Now, I'll have you go back in history a little bit and I think a lot of people remember. Who broke the most treaties with the Indians since the beginning of time? It wasn't the Indians. The Indians lived with their treaties. It was the white man. The white man was the one that broke the treaties. It wasn't the Indians. But for once, I wish people would go back to study, study what the laws are now, study what the laws will be under retrocession and there is no difference. It will permit no more, no less gaming activities as is presently legal under Nebraska law. Now, Senator Hoagland is probably one of the most antigambling people in the legislative body. He took time to go up there and spend a couple days, went to a hearing, did a lot of studying, a lot of legal research and he is comfortable with this. And if he is comfortable with this, I think it should put a lot of you antigambler's minds to ease. It is not a gambling issue. It is what is fair for these people that want to rule themselves and make themselves better. Thank you.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: There are no other lights on. Senator Goll, would you care to close?

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Legislature, first of all, Senator Chambers, thank you for the inquiry concerning...as to whether I had any more amendments to introduce. I think after this long time, those of you who know me, know that I am not the kind of a senator who would deliberately harass or intimidate or judiciously pursue an issue through harassment. Mr. Speaker, because of the delicate nature of this resolution and because as I look over the legislative body, I would like at this time to request a call of the house so that everyone may be here.
