

SENATOR HANNIBAL: So that if he finds that there is noncompliance for right at the direction...or at that determination, then that one month's allocation would be gone and if it is not in compliance the next month, the next month is gone...

SENATOR VICKERS: It is not gone.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: ...until he sees that there is compliance.

SENATOR VICKERS: It is not gone. It is held for them.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Held...

SENATOR VICKERS: It is not gone.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: ...until there is compliance.

SENATOR VICKERS: That is correct.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: And what will constitute compliance or noncompliance?

SENATOR VICKERS: There is already a part of the statute that defines compliance and a hearing process set up as it applies to the compliance of the noxious weed law and so that that hearing process...it could take effect as quickly as five days. It takes five days for the hearing process to work.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Okay.

SENATOR VICKERS: But there is that provision already in and I think it is on page 12 of the amendment.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: What, the definition of compliance or just the hearing stuff? I saw the hearing, but the definition compliance might be someplace else in the statute?

SENATOR VICKERS: The standards are not in this act, I am told, but the standards are in other sections of the statutes.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: All right. Compliance, I am sure, has
