

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: But you must provide for due process statutes or due process in this issue.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Which are not in the committee amendment.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Which are not in the committee amendments and which Senator Vickers...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Which were originally Senator Vickers' amendments.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Which are Senator Vickers' amendment right now, if you follow me. Let me explain it a little bit differently.

SENATOR PIRSCH: I guess I don't have Senator Vickers' amendment in front of me so I am at a loss.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Okay. What Senator Vickers...last year when we adopted the committee amendments, they were basically Senator Vickers' amendments at that time...

SENATOR SCOFIELD: One minute.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: ...and then they became the committee amendments because the committee adopted those amendments along with the other committee amendments. What he is trying to do basically with his amendment right now is to clean up that amendment or the committee amendments to make them constitutional because we must...(interruption).

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, this does not change substantially then what the committee amendment...it just simply...

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: No, the committee amendment will stay the same. All we are providing is due process which was not in the committee amendment.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, I'm sorry, I did not have it in front of me.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: That is what the Attorney General told us we must have in order to make this committee amendment constitutional.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay. Thank you.
