SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beyer, please.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, once again I come before you with a resolution for the transportation industry. I hope that you will look on it favorably. We have a proclamation that will be signed by the Governor before lunch and I think since this ties in with the national, that we should be supportive of it here in the state. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the Beyer resolution. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Beyer resolution is adopted. Move on to Final Reading, please.

CLERK: Mr. President...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Would you please return to your seats so we can go on Final Reading. (Gavel.) Ladies and gentlemen, please return to your seats. We can't continue on Final Reading until you get to your seats. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Have you all returned to your seats? Unauthorized personnel, please leave. Thank you. Mr. Clerk, I believe we need to suspend the rules and so forth.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to suspend the rule requiring the bill to lay over for two days in order to read LB 825 today.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp. The motion is to suspend the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to suspend rules, Mr. President.
