Committee and Senator Johnson came in and gave us a brief description. It is merely a technical change but it is needed and I would urge all of you to support it. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins, please.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to ask Senator Landis if he would yield to a question please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Certainly.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Senator, I notice in the committee statement it says that this bill would apply only with a population in excess of 300,000, Douglas County, in other words. Is that the only county that has civil service? Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any other discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 595 advances. LB 621.

CLERK: 621 by Senator Goodrich. (Read title.) It was first read on January 22 of last year, referred to Government, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Glenn Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, the purpose of this bill is just to delay the implementation of the educational requirements, the con ed, continuing education requirements of the land surveyors for one year and that is all the bill does. It delays it, just stalls it for one year. However, and that is what we are going to ask you to advance from General File to Select File, but on Select File I will have an amendment prepared and it will have been printed in the Journal by then so that you can see what the land surveyors that have gotten together all over
