

the state, have gotten together and drafted in the form of an amendment to clean up the land surveyor legislation, various sections, and we will have that printed in the Journal probably by tomorrow, Monday at the latest, so everybody can see it, and this amendment is one though that with one small exception all the land surveyors have agreed to and by Monday or Tuesday we should, before it gets to Select File, we will probably have that one minor point agreed to so that we can consider that amendment on Select File. That is not being offered now nor is it in this bill. All this bill does right now is delay the continuing education requirements for one year and I ask you to advance it to Select File when on Select File we will consider this other amendment after it has been printed.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this bill came before the Government Committee, and at the time there was very real differences of opinion between land surveyors. And somehow Senator Goodrich has been able to pour oil on the waters and achieve some sense of consensus and compromise and that is why the bill was advanced without dissent. What is being done is to take a year out before these new restrictions apply and to establish some kind of rules to allow the inactive members of the land surveyors and the like to have some way of meeting their obligations and yet to have them relaxed from what other people have. And Senator Goodrich has overseen this compromise process and apparently it nears completion, and judging by how much difference of opinion there was a year ago, he has made tremendous strides. So I would hope that you would advance the bill today and then we would all have a chance to see his handiwork on Select File.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Goodrich, did you wish to close? The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. LB 258.
