SENATOR MARSH: 26 ayes, 12 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

CLERK: Yes, Madam President, I do. I have explanation of vote from Senator Haberman. Notice of hearing from the Education Committee. The Enrolling Clerk has presented to the Governor LB 825. Senator Rod Johnson as Chair of Ag and Environment reports LB 474 to General File with amendments attached. Senator Higgins would like to withdraw LB 647. That will be laid over, Mr. President.
