

\$5.00 fee is divided? Who gets the money from that \$5.00 fee?

SENATOR LYNCH: Okay. I apologize that I just passed out a handout. It does a couple of things. Have you gotten yours yet, Harold? It answers that question on the second page that identifies who pays and who gets what. In the case of the counties, there would be increased fees of about \$32,813, to the General Fund of the state about \$137,738, based on about 20,000 duplicates that regularly are asked for during the year and we assume about 75 percent of the minors may ask for, as they become of age, should they get their license say at 18 or 17, want a duplicate to show that they are, in fact, of age.

SENATOR SIECK: Okay...

SENATOR LYNCH: We are assuming not all of them will want to change their license.

SENATOR SIECK: Okay, by changing the photo, will it cost just as much for the county to change their machines to adapt to this?

SENATOR LYNCH: No, one person that testified was, in fact, the county clerk, I think, from your district.

SENATOR SIECK: Right, yes.

SENATOR LYNCH: And as an old county official, I can understand their concern about any additional work. However, I wasn't too sympathetic when that work would mean they would simply have to take a piece of cloth of a different color and set it behind somebody who is going to have a picture taken anyhow.

SENATOR SIECK: The cost involved in that is very minor then?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, \$2,000 one-time cost to buy the drop-cloths for the clerks' offices to use and the treasurer's office to use.

SENATOR SIECK: Okay. Well, I support the bill. I just kind of wanted these questions...(interruption).
