SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you have any new bills this morning, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one new bill at this point. (Read LB 1122 by title for the first time. See page 418 of the Journal.) That is all that I have at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We'll move on to the resolutions. LR 317, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 317, found on page 251 of the Journal is offered by the Education Committee and signed by its members. (Read.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, this resolution, as read by the Clerk, indicates the concern that was raised by the task force studying the issue of cost containment in special education this past interim in the area of transportation services and the fact that we perhaps could have a mechanism to save the people of the State of Nebraska a considerable amount of money if they could purchase in quantity through DAS. This resolution would ask that that issue be examined and studied. I would simply urge the adoption of this resolution, but I would also suggest that perhaps Senator Baack, who was the Chairman of that task force, or Senator Eret, who was the subchairman or the Chairman of that subtask force related to transportation, could probably explain this issue much better than I. But I would ask for the adoption of the resolution. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goll, please.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. President, I have a question for either Senator Vickers or Senator Baack. Senator Baack, can you, very briefly, how many units a year are involved with the special education?
