SENATOR VICKERS: First week in February.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. February 4.

SENATOR VICKERS: That's fine. I don't know what day of the week that is, but that is fine.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Why don't we pass over it. We'll discuss when we'll put this back on rather than bracket it to a certain date.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Then we'll pass over it for today, both 415 and 415A.

SENATOR VICKERS: Right.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 124.

CLERK: 124, it's a bill by...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rod Johnson is excused for the day. Has anybody been appointed to take up that bill? Okay, move over to LB 153 then.

CLERK: Mr. President, 153 was a bill introduced by Senator Vard Johnson. (Title read.) The bill was first read on January 14 of last year. The bill was advanced to General File. Committee amendments were considered and adopted on March 27 of last year. At that time there was a motion to indefinitely postpone by Senator Chambers which laid the bill over. That is presently before us, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard, would you like to explain it a little bit and then we have a kill motion on that I understand. Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, LB 153 came to me from the City of Omaha and this is a measure which I believe is thoroughly supported by the court system. This measure deals with the suspension of drivers licenses and it deals with the suspension of drivers licenses for people who have been arrested for a moving violation, i.e., they are speeders or they're reckless drivers or they do some other moving violation offense and
