They either park it there or it is towed and then they pay some additional costs and this is something that the Department of Motor Vehicles, an administrative bureaucracy enjoys doing because it gives them a power that law enforcement acting as law enforcement does not have. Law enforcement is carrying out the dictates of what the Department of Motor Vehicles wants. I think a line has to be drawn at some point and the Legislature will not go along with everything that these department heads, lazy judges and lazy law enforcement officials want the Legislature to do. I hope you will consider what this bill does. Don't sleep it today, vote on it, then when your constituents find out what a terrible thing has been done, start backtracking and saying, I didn't know, I didn't realize. You do know, you do realize. It is saying that for something not even connected with driving a vehicle your license can be suspended. Marge is trying to tell me something. I can't pick it all up.
