

says that I should show up, my license is suspended for not showing up to answer the ticket, not because I violated the law or endangered somebody's safety. So if they think certain offenses in a car endanger the public to such an extent that if you commit that offense your license should be suspended, at least you've adopted a philosophical position that is based on what these laws are supposed to foster and that is the safety of the public. This that they are talking about has nothing to do with safety. It has nothing to do with how a person drives. If you have improper display of license plates, that could be considered a moving violation I believe. So you lose your license for that. Then the Department of Motor Vehicles extorts \$25 from you if you want to get your license reinstated. I'm sure there will be doctors, lawyers and other people who have power, and their children, who may not show up for a ticket and whatever certification process has to be gone through will not be gone through for them and they won't lose their license and they won't have to pay a \$25 fee to get it reinstated. But you let an ordinary person out there fall into the clutches of the law, that's who these laws are made for. That's the for whom the Legislature works, the rich, the privileged, the politically powerful, the ones who are not going to come under the provisions of this law. You catch and you rook the suckers and who are the suckers? The ordinary people who are dumb enough to vote to put people like us in this office who are going to work daily against their interests. Then go out among them and say, well I didn't know what that law meant, or I wasn't there when it was considered, but we take the easy way out too many times. That's why I think there is such a ferment in the countryside, the feeling that politicians, judges, lawyers, law enforcement officers are the enemies of the people. There is not that unquestioning, almost naive childlike regard for officials who hold office now because every time they turn around there is something being done by these officials that intrudes directly in their private life and their private activities, their personal life. Here is what I am arguing and Senator Johnson will have a chance to counter it. There is no connection between what this bill requires and safety. The infraction that's called the moving violation need not endanger a soul, but your license can be suspended. You can commit a serious moving violation that not only endangers but injures somebody and your license is not automatically lifted. So how are those hypocrites, and I'm not talking about Senator Johnson, he is
