

January 23, 1986 LB 161, 262

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 262 has a motion pending by Senator Pappas to withdraw that bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. President, colleagues, these are two bills I wish to withdraw because they are burdensome. We have too many bills any way. Neither one of them are presently needed, so I ask unanimous consent to withdraw these two bills.

PRESIDENT: Is there comment? Have to put the matter to a vote. The motion is to withdraw LB 262. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting to withdraw LB 262 at the request of Senator Pappas. Vote aye or nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries, the bill is withdrawn. Now you have to make a motion on the other bill, Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: I make a motion to withdraw LB 161, too. I ask for the motion to get 25 votes.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, Mr. Clerk. The motion is to withdraw LB 161. Is there comment? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting to withdraw LB 161 on the request of Senator Pappas. Please record your vote, aye or nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries, the bill is withdrawn. May we have your attention, please. (Gavel.)
