

Don't you believe that? There is much more, and I'm sure a much more highly intelligent debate that we can have on this particular issue, and perhaps we should have it. I would remind you once again that LB 230, Senator DeCamp's bill, exists for that purpose and will be coming down the pike. It would seem to me appropriate that if you want to discuss changing the law that that is the appropriate vehicle to do it, that Senator DeCamp ought not be able to substitute his bill as an amendment to another bill which was supported by the League of Municipalities and which does some good thing, some very good things. I hope that in the end you will simply think about the public policy considerations because in the end that is the important matter. I think, if you don't talk in the world of theory but you talk in the world of reality and the practical things, that you would agree with me that the average voter out there, that the average homeowner out there ought to have the right to expect that what a politician says 10 days before the election, but more importantly what a politician says 2 days before the election, when there is no right to refute it,...

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...ought to have the reasonable expectation that that is true or near the truth, ought to have the expectation that it is not a blatant lie, that it is not an act of arrogance. I would ask for the repeal of the DeCamp amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion is the adoption of the Beutler amendment which amounts to repeal of the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We're voting on the Beutler amendment which has been under discussion. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? What is your wish, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, Mr. Speaker.

PRESIDENT: Very well. Call of the house has been requested. Question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.
