

district does not enforce properly, then there is a procedure whereby environmental control may take over that responsibility.

PRESIDENT: Ten minutes have expired.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Thank you, Mr. President. I'm about finished anyway. If there are any questions I'd be glad to try to answer them at another time. I would hope that the amendment would be adopted and I would encourage those of you who have cooperated on this to comment on the amendment.

PRESIDENT: There's an amendment to the amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend Senator Schmit's amendment. (Lamb amendment appears on page 477 of the Journal.)

PRESIDENT: May I interrupt you, Senator Lamb, to announce that Senator Morehead has guests under the south balcony from Fairbury, Fern Schamburg, David Boeckner, Councilman, and Jeff Martin. Senator Pappas has, under the north balcony, a constituent of his and an old Keith County friend of mine, Jim Harris of North Platte. We would like to have you all stand and accept our welcome to the Legislature this morning. The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb on your amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, I'm pleased to note that the amendments I have in the Journal have been incorporated into this new amendment. So what I have now here is a relatively small amendment which applies to Section 28 of the bill which deals with the training in regard to pesticide application. This is a small amendment which merely clarifies the fact that if the department does contract with the Extension Division of the university to conduct the training that the Extension Department will be reimbursed for the training expenses. So on page 15 of amendment number 1655, on line 4, after the period, insert the following. You have this information on your desks. "If the department contracts for the training sessions, the Cooperative Extension Service shall be reimbursed for conducting the training sessions." Merely a clarification of what I think is already the intent. But I bring that to you at this point and would ask that the amendment be adopted.
