

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, the one that gives the counseling. It is either the doctor or someone at the abortion clinic that is qualified to do so.

PRESIDENT: And then the amendment to the amendment continues on about the counselors of any organization as to their ability to be qualified and I think the language is similar enough to make the amendment germane to your amendment.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you. I will not challenge the Chair and I will try to defeat the amendment itself.

PRESIDENT: There is a possible other point lurking which I am not at liberty to bring up, but you might if you wish.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I didn't quite get what you said, sir.

PRESIDENT: Well, I just rule that the amendment to the amendment is germane to your amendment.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the amendment to the amendment? We're discussing now the Marsh amendment to the Labeledz amendment. Senator Hall, did you wish to comment?

SENATOR HALL: Yes, Mr. President and members. Senator Marsh, would you yield to a question? Senator Marsh, in your amendment to the amendment...

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.)

SENATOR HALL: Senator Labeledz's amendment lists a series of requirements for counselors.

SENATOR MARSH: That is correct.

SENATOR HALL: And your amendment then says, any organization or counselors that offer pregnancy counseling, crisis pregnancy counseling to individuals who have not been previous members of the organization or which advertises, but if such counselors are not so qualified the organization shall provide a statement to the prospective recipient of the counseling stating basically what they lack in terms of
