

PRESIDENT: Senator Jacklyn Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President. My name is on this bill, and as Senator Higgins commented, I'm interested in having good legislation come out of this piece of legislation, especially since my name is on it. So I have a few questions, some clarification and that sort of thing and I'd like to first of all ask Senator Marsh if I may ask a question or two of her.

SENATOR MARSH: Of course.

SENATOR SMITH: Senator Marsh, now then, I guess I'm a little bit confused as to where this would go. You're attaching this to the amendment on page 1, line 10.

SENATOR MARSH: On page 4.

SENATOR SMITH: On page 1, line 10 of the amendment...

SENATOR MARSH: After Senator Labeledz's, this is an amendment to her amendment...

SENATOR SMITH: Okay.

SENATOR MARSH: ...to the amendment, 1762, and the Marsh amendment is drawn to Senator Labeledz's amendment.

SENATOR SMITH: It would just follow.

SENATOR MARSH: So it would be part of, on page 4, line 3, then this entire package would be inserted.

SENATOR SMITH: All right, and you have said that you could, you would be willing to eliminate the last sentence.

SENATOR MARSH: If you do not wish to have people informed about what their counselors are qualified to do, no matter what kind of counseling they're doing, then you will want that deleted. If you do want the individual to be informed about the qualifications of the counselor, you will want to leave that in so that they will know whether this is a volunteer with the organization, someone who has had training, two years post graduate work such as Senator Scofield has had.
