Should we take it up first or should we explain this one first?

CLERK: Whatever your preference is, Senator.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, I'll explain this one and then we'll take our choice of what we want to do. This particular amendment found on 496 changes the licensing requirements for land surveyors from one year license to a two year license and it also sets up the continuing education requirements for land surveyors and also provides a status whereby land surveyors can go on an inactive status and this is the one I mentioned, this is the amendment rather, I mentioned on General File when we advanced it that I would be coming up with because the land surveyors had gotten together, all over the state, had gotten together and have agreed to this particular amendment and the one that is coming up as an amendment to it. The one that is coming up is the...an extra clause that they later decided to go ahead and put in it, says that the continuing education requirements for an inactive land surveyor would be just one and a half times that which he would have had to do in any one year, any one licensing period biennial period, regardless of how long he had been off. So in essence, if was off three years, or, I'm sorry, three two year periods, he theoretically would have to do 90 hours but in this case he'd have to do 45 hours because he is on an inactive status. So I would suggest that we adopt the amendment to the amendment and then the amendment and then advance the bill.
