PRESIDENT: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: (Microphone not activated.) ...Senator Lamb would respond to a question. Isn't this against your philosophy?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes. Yes. I'm not happy about property tax, as you all know in this body. However, this is a special circumstance to deal with a situation in a sparsely settled area that I don't have a better solution for. So that is the reason I am offering the bill.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion? Any closing? Motion is to advance LB 753 from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. A record vote has been requested.

CLERK: Mr. President, record vote. (Read record vote as found on page 594 of the Journal.) 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. The Chair would like to announce that we have resolution 331 before me which I propose to sign and do sign on this 30th day of April (sic)...of January.

CLERK: Mr. President, I also have a request from Senator Harris to add his name to 1120 as co-introducer.

PRESIDENT: Without objection? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, report of registered lobbyists. Senator Chambers would move to withdraw 671, that will be laid over. An Attorney General's Opinion to Senator Goll. (See Attorney General's Opinion on LB 759 on pages 595-97 of the Legislative Journal.)
