

January 30, 1986 LB 904, 922

SENATOR ABBOUD: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the bill? Any closing? The motion is to advance LB 904. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Motion is to advance LB 904 from General File. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Please record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and the bill is advanced. LB 922.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 922 was introduced by the Public Health and Welfare Committee. It was read for the first time on January 10, 1986, and was referred to the Public Health Committee. (Read.) The committee does refer the bill back to General File without committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, members, this bill was brought to us by the Department of Public Institutions. Right now the same provision provides for alcoholism programs. This deals with mental health programs. Where you have an Indian reservation they don't pay local property taxes, and yet, under the mental health programs, counties have to match state grants, and counties get no property taxes out of the reservation. So this would say, since they don't pay any property taxes, counties don't have to match, with property taxes, the state grant for mental health as well as alcoholism, which we already passed a few years ago. It is a very minor matter. In effect they are kind of doing it right now. But I would appreciate support for the bill.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the bill? If not, the motion is to advance LB 922. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The motion is to advance LB 922. Please record your vote. Please record your vote on the advancement of LB 922. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill.
