

February 3, 1986 LB 1128, 1147

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion? Motion is to withdraw LB 1147. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Voting to withdraw LB 1147, please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdraw the bill.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and the bill is withdrawn. Next motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Labeledz would move to withdraw...is she here yet?

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz's motion. Senator Chambers' motion. Next motion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I don't want to take this motion up. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Okay, we will pass over the motion and, Senator DeCamp, we will recognize you to handle Senator Labeledz's motion. Senator DeCamp.

CLERK: Senator Labeledz would move to withdraw LB 1128. I understand Senator DeCamp is going to handle the motion.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, we just decided this is too heavy to handle this session. The introduction of the bill accomplished discussion and there will be a lot of discussion over the summer on this issue. It is the result of a Supreme Court ruling out of Minnesota, and as I say, it is a very, very heavy issue and it probably would be too heavy for this session.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the motion to withdraw LB 1128? If not, all those in favor of withdrawing the bill vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is withdrawn.
