

in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record vote has been requested. The motion is to place LB 832 on General File notwithstanding committee action. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record your vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 611-12 of the Legislative Journal.) 5 ayes, 30 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to raise the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Anything more further for the record now, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, nothing further.

PRESIDENT: We are to go now to General File, LB 988.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 988 was a bill that was introduced by Senators Beutler, Labeledz, Hall, and Withem. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 14 of this year. Mr. President, it was referred to the Appropriations Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Chairman Warner. May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 988 was introduced in order to consider a deficiency appropriation early. It affects the takeover of the Lincoln and Omaha municipal courts in LB 13 that was enacted in 1984 session but funded in the regular 1985 session. What was appropriated in 1985 was the dollar amount reflected by the A bill or the fiscal note for LB 13. When it was enacted we only adjusted it by the amounts of salary adjustments which had occurred either at the state level or at the higher of the two municipal court and juvenile court levels from the time that the bill was enacted. The question came up frequently or did come up during the course of the last session as to whether or not eight positions which at that time were referred to as service officers were included. Based upon the appropriation, it was clear that those eight positions were not intended to be included in the original bill. Although there is an argument about what the language may or may not
