SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, if anybody is interested in what this amendment will do, you can look at the Standing Committee amendment and on line 8 in that amendment I'm taking out the words "shall not" and inserting the word "may". Here is what the language would read then. "Which may include the operation of a motor vehicle between his or her place of residence and his or her place of employment." With the current language, a person who has one of these permits is not allowed to drive to work or from work. My amendment would make it discretionary with the court to allow the person to drive to work and from work. I'm doing this for a particular reason. I'm always sensitive to laws and propositions of law that can favor those who are in a favored position already. Senator Hoagland told me that a spouse could drive such a person to and from work if the person has a spouse. There is nothing in this that indicates that everybody affected will be married or have a relative or have the means to obtain transportation to and from work. Believe it or not, there are jobs that people have where driving is required and they don't make large amounts of money. So somebody
