PRESIDENT: Thirty seconds.

SENATOR SCHMIT: What I would suggest again, and I don't know if Senator DeCamp would buy this, I would suggest we not revive LR 16 and then let Senator DeCamp take his resolution and circulate it, see if he can get 25 votes to attach it to CA35, and if he can do that, I think the time will be well spent, because I think that at the present time emotions are such that no resolution on this floor is going to secure a fair vote. So I would hope that if this motion fails, that some of you will at least give Senator DeCamp and those...Senator Conway, the opportunity to attach this to CA35, and I know there are going to be those who will say...

PRESIDENT: Time has expired, Senator.

SENATOR SCHMIT: ...it is a waste of time, but nothing is a waste of time that is as important as the prosperity of this state. That is what we are looking at.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, there has been a number of references made to the red meat machine and the damage, as Senator DeCamp put it, that we are going to do to that particular industry or that machine. You know, it sounds an awfully lot to me like the arguments made over a number of years to build a vet school in the State of Nebraska. A lot of people back then were saying, we have got to have it in order to keep the red meat industry and keep the cattle industry and the animal industry going. Now, some folks are saying, we have got to do away with Initiative 300 in order to keep the red meat and the cow industry going. Well, I will tell you what. It seems to me that we have got a lot of hills out there that are not good for a heck of a lot else than growing cows on them. We have got a lot of ground in this country that grows...or in this
