

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Chambers.

CLERK: Do you need me to read your amendment, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the body will know what the amendment is.

CLERK: (Read the Chambers amendment.)

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, and, Senator Schmit, I want you to hear this. The amendment says, among those who will not be allowed to get one of these permits to drive, they cannot fly any aircraft regardless of whether motor driven or not, "or". I think it is appropriate. Since the bill has been rendered ridiculous by those unjust souls who think the families of cab drivers have no value, the families of truck drivers have no value, we certainly shouldn't have drunks flying aircraft. Who can disagree with that? There have been crashes of commercial planes because pilots were tipsy. There have been near mid-air collisions because pilots were tipsy. So I don't think that the families of those who fly airplanes in the course of their employment should be allowed to do so if they have been convicted of driving while drunk. I am surprised that Senator Hoagland hasn't taken issue with this amendment. Maybe he favors it. I don't think there are enough people who fly aircrafts that have either the money or the votes to be a significant factor in campaigns, so this amendment might fly in a manner of speaking even though it is going to ground those who ordinarily would fly without it. I am not going to extend the discussion on this amendment because I think it is very clear what it says and the intent is clear. So I am asking that you vote aye on this amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, we have faced these arguments. We have addressed the policy questions and now the well orchestrated dissent simply has us going over these things over and over again. I object to that form. I know our rules permit it and all I can say is that I think the will of the body should be permitted to be done after having a full
