SENATOR MARSH: The amendment fails. Do you have another amendment?

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Haberman. (Read the Haberman amendment. See page 649 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, and members of the body, what we are doing is we are creating a special situation, a special license, and I am thinking about what happens if this individual's ride doesn't show up. You know, somebody is supposed to pick him up, or her up, or them up, and I don't want to get in a fight over that, and take them from home to work and from work back home. Well, now what happens if his ride goes on vacation, his ride's car breaks down, his ride's wife has to go to the hospital and have a baby, his ride doesn't show up? Well, now he has got to go to work and if he doesn't show up at work, he might lose his job. So what is he going to do? Same thing I would do. I would get in the car and I would drive to work and hope that I didn't get caught. And then after work, well, I have got my car, well, I'll stop with some of my buddies and, you know, have a couple beers, and so what we are doing is we are creating a situation where really nobody can win. We are supposed to be doing this to save jobs, but by the same token we can lose lives. So I am saying that if somebody violates this rule that Senator Hoagland wants, if they violate this driver's permit back and forth to work, then let's make the sentence tough. Let's say, okay, we gave you a second shot, gave you a second shot under special circumstances and you chose to violate them. You did it, nobody else, you are a responsible person. The Legislature in its wisdom gave you the right to drive while you are working, but, no, you violated it, so if you are going to do this, you are going to lose your license for 10 years. They shouldn't have a second chance or another six months because in some counties they don't enforce the law and some counties they put them in some sort of a driver's education program and even on a first offense they don't take the license. So if we are going to go along with this amendment or this bill to create this special class of people, which I think is unconstitutional, but we will find that out this afternoon, let's put the hammer to them.
