

roll call vote, please.

SENATOR MARSH: Call of the house has been requested. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR MARSH: The house is under call. Senators, the house is under call. Please indicate your presence. Senator Labeledz, would you like to indicate your presence. Senator Goodrich, Senator Vard Johnson, Senator Landis. Senator Landis is here. A roll call vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. (See pages 650-51 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 20 nays, Madam President.

SENATOR MARSH: The bill is not advanced. Mr. Speaker, Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Madam President and members of the Legislature, just a word about tomorrow. As you know, LR 16 needs to be handled and I had intended to just refer it to the Executive Board but there were objections so we will be taking up 16 tomorrow for the purpose of talking about the logistics of it, not the merits of 300 or demerits of it, but merely how the committee will be structured, how it will be handled and because of the severity of the amendment, I just thought it probably better to start from scratch with the body so that there is no dissension as to who is on the committee or how long the committee will be in existence. So we will be discussing that the first thing tomorrow morning. Secondly, we will have three priority bills, this year's priority bills that we are going on now. Senator Nelson, Senator Marsh and Senator Chizek each have their priority bills lined up for tomorrow. Friday we will have a little Final Reading and some Select File, so it is just so you know what will be going on. Thank you, Madam Chairman.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Hannibal. Mr. Clerk, is there anything to read in?

CLERK: Yes, Madam President. Madam President, your committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance whose Chair is Senator DeCamp to whom was referred LB 1042 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the
