SENATOR HARTNETT: Another question, how much raised from tuition and how much comes from property tax?

SENATOR NELSON: Offhand, and I will check that out, I think I want to say 40 percent but I could be wrong on that. Just a minute. Go ahead, I will hunt it up.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I guess I have some concern even though it doesn't affect me, and I have been told that, reassured, and so forth, because I think the next thing we can hear is counties coming in and saying because counties have a limit, well, we need a raise because property tax is going down and so forth.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So I guess I have some concern. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Jacklyn Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Well, I am going to try to talk to a few issues that have been raised and then I will relinquish the rest of my time, Mr. President, to Senator Nichol. I would like to just show Senator Hartnett that on the handout that I provided, in addition to answering some of the other questions that you asked, you have a listing of some of the kind of continuing education that are being provided by the community colleges, and I think Senator Nelson answered some of the other concerns that you had, but I also would like to speak to Senator Lamb's amendment just a little bit, if Senator Lamb is here.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb is here. Senator Lamb. You are being asked for a question.
