SENATOR GOLL: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Members of the Legislature, I would just like to add my support for this bill. This is special legislation. It is evidently necessary to provide the transportation services that are needed for folks that need that service. I wouldn't want to go on record, or any other way, as holding any kind of grudge, if you want to call it that, because we felt that we weren't maybe receiving total consideration the other day when we had more of a localized concern for, or if you want to call it rural Nebraska concern, when we were addressing the need to increase the levy for community colleges. All I can say is that I do intend to support this because I know that it is something that people do need. I'm hoping that the next time around maybe we can get a little bit better support from some folks that weren't that considerate the first time for us. So I go on record supporting this. I hope that we will move this through for you, Senator Hall. When Senator Nelson's priority bill comes up the next time let's see some votes for that too because that addresses the same kind of need, only in a different area with a different group of people. Thank you.

SENATOR GOLL: Sena+or Hall. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I want to respond a little bit to Senator Smith. I wonder if Senator Nelson or Senator Smith would like to have a sunset on their technical college bill because one of the things we did in the Revenue Committee, on which I sit with Senator Hefner, we did put a sunset on it, so that it doesn't go on for a long period of time. So is that what you are saying, that you people will accept a sunset on your technical college...I'm just kidding, of course. Thank you.

SENATOR GOLL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, just to respond to Senator Hartnett, the community technical colleges do have a sunset on their property taxing authority. Currently, that is 1988. There is a bill, which was advanced by the committee, which extends that to 1992.
