

Board to appoint all 12 members, or up to 12 members, 6 of whom would be senators, and 6 who would be from the general population. I oppose that first portion of the Scofield amendment which gave the Governor the opportunity to appoint 6, the Legislative Executive Board to appoint 6. The body did not agree with me on that point. I, personally, feel that the Governor should not be involved in this process. This is the same Governor who appointed me. He could make additional mistakes. (Laughter.) With that, the hour being so late, I would respectfully withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any objection? It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I will withdraw that amendment. Mr. Speaker, may I say that in about two minutes I'm going to ask to withdraw the amendment. If there is a co-signer who would like to stay on the amendment, because it now purports to follow their intention for the language, I'll be happy to accept them as a co-signer. That way we won't lose the amendment before the body.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you want to withdraw the amendment? The amendment has been amended, so you can't withdraw it. Okay. What do you want to do now?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is...Senator DeCamp, Senator, I have two. This is the one that says strike the Governor from appointing six members.

SENATOR DECAMP: No, forget that, let him do it.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to amend by adding a new section.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, this is real simple.

CLERK: (Read DeCamp amendment found on page 724 of the Journal.)
