Senator Lowell Johnson has designated LB 105 as his priority bill.

If I could see them in my office at one-thirty, I'd appreciate it. We'll try to work something out so that we don't do this day, after day, after day. Mr. Clerk, do you have anything else? Senator Haberman, would you like to adjourn us until tomorrow at nine o'clock. No, all I want to talk about is adjournment.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I'd like to have a point of personal privilege.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, state your point.

SENATOR HABERMAN: In a point of personal privilege may you ask another senator a question?

SPEAKER NICHOL: No, just state your point.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I wonder if we have to have a deficit budget for this program, where the \$20,000 is going to come that I read about in the paper for the special committee that the Executive Board put into effect because that is going to cost \$20,000 also. Thank you.
