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say...you see, I guess as I say, I am agreeing with your concept but I am trying to say, is your bill saying exactly what you want to say? You are saying that they can't do this for the furtherance of a civil disorder, but evidently it is okay if I say, well, I want to do it to rob a bank.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Senator, that is a separate criminal offense, specifically covered by federal law and other statutes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, then if it is covered by federal law, then...I just think you have got some problems with your bill. That is all I am saying and I would suggest that you work on those two things because if somebody challenges this you might have a few problems. That is all that I have, Mr. President. Thank you. If you want to answer, go ahead.

SENATOR CHIZEK: The bill is patterned after similar legislation, Senator, in 11 states that have already enacted it.

SENATOR HABERMAN: The answer to that, Senator Chizek, is Nebraska's Attorney General's Office is a little bit different than any other state and so is our Supreme Court. So I don't think I would rest all of my laurels on what they do in other states. I am just suggesting to you that you look at this and get it cleared exactly what it means if somebody would take it to the Supreme Court or the Attorney General to rule on. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this bill at first blush has an allure but it is a very bad bill. It is worse than LB 626, that drunk driving permit bill, was. I call it an Alice in Wonderland legislative bill and I am going to walk through it and I am going to take however much time is necessary so that you can see what a pernicious bill this is. It infringes on the rights, very important rights, of freedom of speech, assembly, association, and even thought. This is a bill which I want you to understand very clearly from the beginning does not deal with any conduct which is illegal. Not a single act that is talked of in this bill is illegal. It becomes illegal only if some officer can figure that your
