

not looking at what the bill makes a crime? Why does he think I called it a fortune-telling bill if I am not talking about what is in the minds of people? The problem is that the determination of what is in a person's mind as far as intent or future activity is the opinion of a law enforcement officer who is given under this bill the power to arrest people if, in his or her judgment, they have the wrong intent when they engage in otherwise completely legal, protected by the law, conduct. Since Senator Beutler has agreed or conceded that this section is not essential to the bill, you ought to go ahead and strike it. But if you don't strike it, then you leave in an escape hatch which makes it possible for any of these groups if they identify themselves in your face and say, we are of the Shield, the Sword and the Arm of the Lord, we are the Aryan Nation, we are the Jewish Defense League or the Jewish Defense Organization, which has made threats against Arab Americans and produced a hit list of people who are to be wiped out in this country. Meir Kahane, who is now a member of the Israeli Parliament, was written about as a homegrown American-trained terrorist who engaged in terrorist activity while in this country and has sent lists from Israel encouraging terroristic activity in this country. But I didn't hear Senator Chizek, I don't ever hear Mr. Crouse, or the others pushing this bill, talk about the groups that have been attacked by Jewish terrorist groups. So what we are looking at here is not a bill aimed at protecting all of society from people who would engage in conduct that is destructive of the rights of the people. We are talking about a fear that a particular group has and based on that fear they want to prohibit certain types of discussion and assemblies, even when nothing more than assembling and the utilization of speech are involved. So if you don't want to have the provision that gives them all the escape hatch, I think you should support this amendment that I am offering.
