

will be occasions when they don't care how I react. Who cares that I think the bill is unconstitutional or hurtful of the rights of the citizens as a whole or the constitutional progress...process? As Senator Beutler said, he said five votes, it has been as high as ten, I think. So there is a number of senators in this body who are looking at the issues. I am going to give you an example of how much misinformation is being given. When Senator Beutler talks, I wrote down his words, he said, the act of causing a disorder should be illegal, but this bill does not make it illegal to engage in an act causing a disorder. This bill does not deal with causing a disorder at all and reporters can't get that straight. They won't even read the bill. Senator Beutler mentioned, I guess he said a parade for Martin Luther King because that would appeal to me, but the man that I respected among black people was Malcolm X who believed in self-defense. I never honor those for my personal guidance who let people spit on them and they love them or slap them around and not a single woman in here would want to be with a man who, if some man came up to assault her and spat on her, she said, I just love him all the more and then they would knock her down and he would say, I am going to pray for her. She would say, you cowardly rascal, get up and do something about this. So as far as the tactics, I give Martin Luther King's tactics to Senator Beutler. But let's say that there was going to be a parade for Martin Luther King and some groups were going to intrude into the parade who had no permit and needed one. That is a violation of the law right now. The examples he gives, you don't need 772 for. Portions of this bill cannot come to grips with what it does. They keep talking about disorder. They keep talking about bombs, incendiary devices and firearms. They ignore the key word, technique, which is not defined in the bill. If you teach a technique, whatever that means, that could hurt somebody, that is a Class IV felony. So forget the bombs, the incendiary devices, the explosives and the firearms. And you know something else that is a firearm under this bill? A pipe. A steel pipe. It is a firearm. It doesn't have to be converted to expel a projectile with the aid of an explosive device or charge. If it can be readily converted to that, it is a firearm. So all the other firearm laws on the books now have a broad definition of what constitutes a firearm. That is the kind of bill 772 is. And Senator Beutler and Senator Chizek want you to hurry it on across the board and I don't care if you hurry it on across the board. It is not going to be a
