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the Clerk to read the amendment to the motion to suspend the rules.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President Senator Chambers' motion or amendment, I should say, to the suspension motion reads as follows: "Strike the period at the end and add, but only after consideration of the following amendment: In Section 2, insert a new paragraph: For any person to distribute, post or lend any written material consisting of information regarding the use, application, or making of any firearm, explosive or incendiary device, or any technique capable of causing injury or death to persons when such person knows or has reason to know or intends that such information will be unlawfully employed for use in or in furtherance of a civil disorder."

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'll make one final point, Mr. Speaker. If you rule that this is in order, then we are going to have a crisis in this Legislature because this body has, this body has rejected time after time an attempt to have time limits on debate. The only time limit we have in this body, on debate, as Senator DeCamp well knows, is a motion to suspend the rules. If you, at this point in time, allow a substantive amendment to a motion to suspend the rules, we are in chaos for the remainder of the session.

SPEAKER NICHOL: As I understand it, we rely on Mason's Legislative Manual when we get into a situation of this nature. Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: May I speak? I was trying to get some clarification while up there and I didn't.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Please talk into the microphone, Senator Chambers, so I can hear you. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I was having a few words with the Clerk while I was up there and he made reference to Mason's. But I think something that ought to be made clear is that Mason's is not incorporated into the rules of this Legislature. We have rules that are not in Mason's. We have done many things on this floor with and without rules
