

hand and you said, for what reason do you rise, Senator Beutler? And he said, a point of order. And then he was allowed to make his point. And then he stopped talking. Senator Chambers went back to his original argument on the amendment. And, yet, I, who have had my light on, had it on to make a motion to adjourn. Now I can't make that motion because if I follow the rules, as those who are so "sticklish" on the rules or ticklish on the rules, I can't make the motion to adjourn. But I'm merely making the point that once somebody stands up for a point of order, and they finish talking, I don't think they should be allowed to just walk up to the microphone and constantly keep talking, and talking, and talking, and the Chair just allow them to do that. That is my point. Now I wish I could make the motion to adjourn, but Senator Landis, and Senator Beutler, and Senator Hoagland, and those who know the rules keep saying you can't talk about anything else. But we could have, Senator Hoagland, gotten out of here earlier and saved all this time that you people on that side, who have been arguing about this bill, you have now wasted 10 minutes when you said you wanted to save time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion now is to overrule the Chair. Your light is on. Would you like to speak, Senator Higgins?

SENATOR HIGGINS: (Microphone not on)...adjourn until 9:00 a.m., February 13th.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. You are not adjourned. Senator Higgins, you may speak. No, you have made the motion. Now we are back to Senator Chambers, then Senator Beutler, then Senator DeCamp. The motion is to overrule the Chair. Senator Beutler...or Senator Chambers, please. I'm sorry. But you haven't spoken...Senator Beutler, you haven't spoken on overruling the Chair yet, have you. Okay, you may do that and then Senator Chambers is up.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I have really already made the main and crucial point to you. You all recognize that the only rule, the only device that we have in this Legislature for closing off debate, the only thing that controls an unlimited filibuster by just one
