CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 790 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Do you have anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, the next motion I have is an amendment by Senator Pappas. (Pappas amendment appears on page 626 of the Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: The call is raised. Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. Speaker, colleagues, this amendment was brought to us by bill drafters. It was too large just to go under just regular E & R. It basically corrects some language. It has been filed. Basically what it says is, "and may be cited," and "The Revisor of Statutes shall, wherever the phrase Sections 81-2101 to 81-2145 appears in statutes, change such phrase, if necessary, to include Section 3 of this act." That was the one thing that was overlooked. They thought it was too big to just go under E & R, so they asked us to introduce it as an amendment. I'd ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? The question is the adoption of the Pappas amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Pappas's amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Pappas amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to...Senator Haberman wishes to withdraw. Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend. (Lamb amendment appears on pages 790-91 of the Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, this puts the exemption up to 3,500. It is compromise time. Senator Pappas indicated earlier he wanted a compromise. So here we go on the
