PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, a question of Senator DeCamp, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp is available.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator DeCamp, does this bill go further than the compromise bill of 1239 that the committee put out?

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, the answer is...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Just does it go further? Yes or no. Yes or no, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, see, 1239 is the wrong bill, so...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Does this go further?

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, you won't let me answer.

SENATOR HABERMAN: All right.

SENATOR DECAMP: The wrong bill.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Just does this go further than 1239, the bill that was put out by the committee? Does your amendment go further than that bill?

SENATOR DECAMP: This amendment goes way further than 1239 because 1239 had nothing to do with pre-judgment interest.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you very much, Senator DeCamp. Thank you very much.

SENATOR DECAMP: You have got the wrong bill number is what I am telling you.

SENATOR HABERMAN: What was the compromise bill we put out of the committee?

SENATOR DECAMP: That bill is 1232.

SENATOR HABERMAN: All right. Does this bill go further than 1232?
