In other words, it is not mandatory, it is not necessary, it is merely an optional thing. And 1232 does not exempt political subdivisions. I think to deal with this issue at this point in time you have to exempt political subdivisions. So those are the differences and, as I say, one is a very, very major, huge difference, which is the discretionary versus the other. With that said, I would urge you to adopt the amendment.
