CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR HALL: I withdraw that, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hall would move to amend and Senator Hall's amendment is on page 748 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall. May we have order in the Chamber, please, so we can hear the speaker. (Gavel.) Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, this amendment does three things. It is a simple amendment and whether or not the DeCamp, Hannibal, Lundy amendment had been adopted or not, we would have had to have done part of that and that is why the first amendment I had up there was withdrawn. It basically coordinates the Hannibal-DeCamp amendment with the Standing Committee amendments. It incorporates some minor technical changes suggested by the Court Administrator, Mr. Steele, and then it makes some minor language changes that were suggested by the bill drafter. So it just basically clarifies how the interest rate is to be posted and when it is to be decided that it is effective. Other than that, you know, if there are any questions, I would urge the body to adopt the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Further discussion on the Hall amendment? If not, all those in favor of the amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting on the Hall amendment to LB 298. Please record your vote.
