

Scofield and Senator Warner. Senator Warner, would you record your presence, please. The house is under call. All members of the Legislature, please return to the Legislative Chamber and record your presence. Senator Lynch, Senator Vard Johnson, Senator Conway. Senator Rod Johnson is here. Senator Goodrich, thank you. Senator Lynch and Senator Vard Johnson. Senator Nichol, please record your presence. Senator Lynch and Vard Johnson, please report to the Legislative Chamber, the house is under call. Senators Lynch and Vard Johnson, if you are in the building, please come to the Legislative Chamber. Here is Senator Vard Johnson. And, Senator Dan Lynch, please report to the Legislative Chamber, the house is under call. How do you wish to proceed on the voting, Senator Hefner?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I would like to have a roll call vote taken after Senator Lynch arrives.
