SENATOR WARNER: Well, I would leave some time for Senator Landis. I would just again call your attention that the...

PRESIDENT: Senator, lift your microphone up a little bit, we are not hearing you too well.

SENATOR WARNER: It seems to be tired.

PRESIDENT: You have a limber microphone.

SENATOR WARNER: The accumulative...the increase, as I indicated before, would not commence until 1987, leaving no increase for 19...excuse me, 1988, no increase next year. After that commencing in '88 the increase would be 67,000 for all of them; 88,000 the following year; eighty-eight nine; 42,000 the next year and about half of that, 22,000 the last year, over the four fiscal years. I just happen to believe that the salaries proposed here are commensurate with the responsibilities and are not unreasonable. During the entire time I have been here I have never seen a salary for constitutional officers go uncontested or not argued. It is, obviously, a spotlighted position. But I think these salaries proposed here are extremely reasonable in terms of what we expect from those individuals who serve in those offices and I would hope the body would adopt these amendments.
