SENATOR DECAMP: I'll talk for one minute and yield the balance of my four minutes to Senator Schmit, Chairman of the committee. He's concerned that the question will be called and he will not get a chance. Mr. President, very briefly in my one minute, I tend to agree very strongly with Senator Chambers that there has not been a session, in my recent memory, where so many bills affecting individual rights, particularly constitutional rights, are at issue. Maybe it is for that very reason that I put the motion in. I was not here on the day the vote was taken. I was excused in a court case. I believe let's get them all up here, one after another, and compare and see what direction this Legislature in this state is going on the whole question of individual rights versus constitutional...I mean constitutional rights versus government involvement. Whether it be the paramilitary's or whatever, maybe when we see enough of this we may pick a direction that is different then the direction the Legislature seems to be heading at this particular point in time. Senator Schmit, I'd yield my time to you. I do support the motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, you have...
