PRESIDENT: The motion carries, the rules are suspended to place the bill on General File and will be put on the agenda by the Speaker. That is my orders from the Speaker on his agenda. Yes, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I believe the rules require another vote and the time has expired, Mr. President. I believe that we ought to follow the rules. The time has expired.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I believe he is right, Mr. President. I had not intended to go further, but I believe he is right in having another vote as to resurrect it. So I would yield to the druthers of Senator Schmit, since he is wise and knows the rules so very well. I would suggest that we follow Senator Schmit's suggestion.

PRESIDENT: Then, Mr. Speaker, I would assume your agenda now will allow a time to consider this matter.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, and I would hope it would not take a lot of time, but I don't have any restraint on that part.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I was under the impression, Mr. Speaker, that if this motion to suspend the rules were successful, we would immediately proceed to a vote on whether to pull the
