

this issue because they can't enforce, they can't get convictions under the current law, then what they should have done is come in and change the current law to apply to all vehicles. They shouldn't come in with a bill that says we are going to app...we are going to change the current law for only specific vehicles. That is what I object to. The rules of the road ought to be the same for everybody. It ought not make any difference if I'm out there with a pickup pulling a horse trailer, which I would be subject to under this law, under this bill, I would be subject to having to follow at a different distance than I would if I was out there with a pickup without a horse trailer. That doesn't make sense to me. If one way is safe and prudent, the other way had ought to be as well for whichever kind of vehicle. The same thing is true with the state roads vehicles. As I said earlier, I have sympathy for those people. But simply because you are a state roads employee with an orange pickup doesn't mean that the law ought to be different for you in that vehicle that it is for any other pickup. What difference does it make if the pickup is orange or if it is green, or brown, or dirt colored? I can't see that we ought to change the law to that regard. I urge you to indefinitely postpone this bill so that the law remains the same for all vehicles, or the other choice I guess is to change the law so that the change is applicable to all vehicles. Thank you, Mr. President.
