SENATOR BARRETT: Motion has been made to advance the bill. There are amendments on the bill. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item on 325 on Select are E & R amendments, Senator.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator Hall, for E & R amendments, please.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would move the E & R amendments be adopted.

SENATOR BARRETT: Motion made to adopt the E & R amendments. All in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed no. Carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Wesely. Senator, this is the amendment you had printed last year. It is AM1448. (Amendment found on page 2312 of the Legislative Journal, First Session.)

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, okay. Mr. President, members, this amendment really doesn't affect anybody or any cost or anything. What it does is it allows state employees when they retire, and remember LB 325 originally was a bill dealing only with state employee retirement and trying to clean up a number of provisions in the retirement provisions for state employees. But anyway, back to the original intent of the bill. This amendment deals with the situation where a state employee retires and then, say in some circumstance, wants to go to another job or doesn't really want to retire, doesn't want that annuity to start right away upon retirement, this would allow them to delay up to the age of 70 receiving their annuity. So it doesn't cost anything, in fact, it may save some money and it gives them that option. I don't think there would be very many people that would want to do that, but this would give them that flexibility, so I'd ask your support for the amendment.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator DeCamp, on the amendment.
