Revenue Committee, the Urban Affairs Committee, and from the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you. Speaker Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, we'll go now to LB 774. Upon the completion of that we'll return to where we were with LB 325, and complete the day in that order. Thank you.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Nichol.

CLERK: Mr. President, 774 was offered by the Revenue Committee. (Read.) The bill was read on January 8 of this year, was referred to the Revenue Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. I do have Revenue Committee amendments pending. (Standing Committee amendments are found on page 479 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, Senator DeCamp has a bet with me. His bet is that I cannot have this bill advanced by eleven-O-nine. It is a noncash bet, so it is not gambling, it is a handshake. This is the celebrated bank tax bill. This bill has been worked through this summer, this fall, and this winter. The first item I am going to ask you to adopt, if you would, are technical amendments of the Revenue Committee itself designed to make certain that the bank tax law works even better than we had originally worked up. So, with that, I would offer the amendments.

SENATOR BARRETT: The motion is to adopt the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Voting on the committee amendments to 774. Have you all voted? Please vote on the committee amendments.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Don't ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, Mr. President, while we are waiting for the other votes just a point of order. I am the one that says it can be done in five minutes and he's the one that doesn't know. We now have three, so I wish you'd vote.
