CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Madam President.

SENATOR MARSH: The resolution is adopted. We are now ready for LR 346.

CLERK: 346 is on page 902. It is offered by Senator Pappas as well.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: It is very seldom I have the opportunity to bring in front of this body two fine resolutions as I have this morning. The second resolution deals with something that was started in Lincoln, Nebraska back in 1964, brought forth by the Game and Parks Commission to celebrate or show that the total State of Nebraska is behind tourism, western heritage and et cetera. Through a series of events it was moved to North Platte, Nebraska. It is a statewide celebration that is everybody, every community in the state almost partakes in it. I have a handout here that shows you one of the original ones in 1966 from the NEBRASKALAND Days magazine. It shows that every community is urged to partake in any way to help Nebraska a memorable place to visit, again and again. It was conceived by the Game Commission and the state official tourists' agency as a prime way to show off Nebraska vacation tourist and recreation areas. It all began back in 1964. That is when the first NEBRASKALAND on Parade swept through Lincoln. I ask this body to commemorate the celebration of the western heritage, statewide tourism, vacations, and I hope nobody talks on this and we can vote on it very quickly.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Morehead.

Senator Pappas introduced this in the form of a bill to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee and we had quite a discussion about this issue in the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee and we do sit on the opposite sides of the room.
