

February 21, 1986 LB 300, 448

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Proceed to LB 448.

CLERK: 448, Mr. President, is a bill by Senator Hoagland. (Read title.) It was read on January 21 of last year, referred to the Judiciary Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chairman Hoagland of the committee.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: What this bill does, ladies and gentlemen, is it expands the definition of a household member under the Domestic Abuse Act to include people that are living together. There was a bill, you know, offered by the Appropriations Committee to repeal the Domestic Abuse Act that we heard in the Judiciary Committee a couple of days ago. This, of course, is not that. This simply expands the definition so that if you have an abuser who is not a spouse but someone living with someone else, the normal statutory authority provides and the committee amendments which I will now ask you to adopt simply clarifies that expansion of that definition. I would ask the adoption of the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments are adopted and there is an amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hoagland would move to amend. Senator Hoagland's and Marsh and that amendment is on page 844 of the Journal.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Let me withdraw that amendment, if I might.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn.
